The Cross-Channel Forum : the voice of the Channel area's stakeholders

The Cross-Channel Forum, initiated by the CAMIS project, took place for the first time in October 2010 in Exeter, Devon, with the aim to highlight the specific issues facing the Channel area.

This Forum is intended to be a platform for expression and exchange between sea and coastal stakeholders who are interested in the future of the Channel area (representatives from national governments, local authorities and European institutions and stakeholders from sectors such as maritime economy, innovation and research, higher education and environment), with a view to developing an integrated maritime strategy for this maritime basin.

This second Cross-Channel Forum meeting will be structured around a series of workshops to maximise discussion and gather information from attendees. These exchanges are intended to :

- Discuss the high level objectives of the Integrated Maritime Strategy of the Channel area.
- Begin identification and discussion of potential actions relating to integration across the Channel area.
- Discuss the potential for a future Cross Channel Forum.
- Provide opportunities for participants to network and gain a wider knowledge of the Channel area.

What is an “integrated maritime strategy”?

The CAMIS integrated maritime strategy is a document which aims to set out a series of common objectives and propose concrete solutions to address the key challenges faced by the Channel area.
